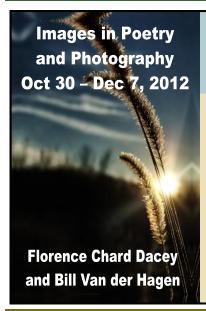

Ok-to-ber-fest

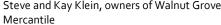

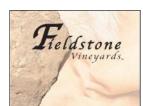
